Crémant de Bourgogne « Blancs de Blancs » - White



As you know me and as any French person, my ego is quite big: So I wanted at some point to see my name on a label. As I do not produce any wine, I needed to ask a friend I trust enough to make it for me. And as I wanted to have a wine that fully represents my personality and philosophy – easy going, wine to share at any time, not too expensive and festive – Crémant seemed to be the perfect product!

Made by Frederic Brand, the godfather of my son (just to give you an idea of how much I trust him 😊), this Crémant de Bourgogne “Blanc de Blancs” is a blend of Chardonnay for 70% et Aligoté for 30%. Crisp, fresh, full of citrusy and floral notes, it shows a light buttery aromatic in the end of the mouth. Its 8 grams per liter of dosage sugar gives it a little roundness to make it the perfect drink for any moment.



Auguste & Maurice
Pernand Vergelesses « Les Boutières » 2024



Auguste & Maurice were my two grandfathers, both winemakers.

Auguste was considered among the best winemakers of Meursault in his time, vinifying the most famous local plots, including Montrachet, and a quite serious grandpa.

Maurice was the Grandpa every grandson dreams of, having fun with me on every vacation. He was making easy and fruity wines for reasonable prices.

This Pernand Vergelesses is a selection I made as an homage to them, a serious well made wine that anyone can enjoy for its white flowers driven bouquet and its refreshing salinity, with a hint of vanilla from the oak in the finish.

Just have simple cheese plate of some crackers with it, but don't forget to have some friends with you, because the best wine is the one we share!

Richard Angonin
Bourgogne Pinot Noir 2022 - RED

For the earliest followers of our offers, Richard Angonin Pinot Noir was one of the first wine I offered, 4 years ago. Rich, powerful and tannic, its Bourgogne Pinot noir was one of the bottles I was advising to keep for ageing, even though this was "just" a Bourgogne regional appellation.

As I'm not always patient and you might not be too, I thought ageing some for you could be a good option, to show people how a well made Pinot Noir can age. Spices, dried berries, a hint of jammy blackcurrant, this Pinot is now fully ready to drink (even if allowing an hour of opening won't hurt him). Light and long body, tannins are still there, but much softened than they used to be.

My preference for the pairing? A nice juicy roasted duck with cranberries, or for cheese lovers, a cow milk creamy (and if possible, stinky) cheese, like a Langres or Munster, even if my local favorite would be Epoisses, of course!



Domaine Michel Gay & Fils

Chorey les Beaune 2022 - RED



I met Sébastien Gay (left) when I arrived in Beaune to study vineyard management and oenology in 1997, in Beaune. Already then, Sébastien would leave school just after the ring bell to jump on his tractor and plough, spray, trim, and do all the work needed as he considered details can't wait if we want the best from the vines.

Time have pasted, but be assured the spirit is the same, with just a few extra grey hairs! Always in a rush, always busy, Sebastien will tell you he can't see you until you're here, and then will discuss and share his passion for hours! Along with his brother Laurent (right), they now run together the family estate.

A hidden gem as I like them, in a lesser-known appellation: Chorey has a typical rough tannic structure and leathery note wine, with medium mouthfeel: it usually needs a bit of ageing to open up and reveal itself.

This Chorey is perfectly in this style, with dried berries and juicy notes coming straight at the opening, white pepper and cocoa next, and a little grip that smoothen with a on hour of air: think about a quickly snacked steak, with pepper and cream sauce.

Domaine Denis Carré

Auxey Duresses 1er cru « Bas des Duresses » 2023 - RED

A family domaine founded in 1975 in Meloisey, in the Hautes-Côtes de Beaune, by Denis Carré, joined in 2008 by his children Gaëtane (pictured this September, removing the hooks between the wires of the trellis system) and Martial to carry the estate forward together. Organic farming was certified after 3 years of conversion in 2020.

All the wines of the estate in the vintage 2023 show a great maturity with no overripe fruit flavors: just the right round and smooth texture, with no aggressive tannins.

Of course, as I love to promote my home village, I chose the "Bas des Duresses" climat of Auxey-Duresses. South east facing, the climat's shows structured, spice-inflected character, and a well-knit tannic frame.



Domaine du Clos des Poulettes

Nuits Saint Georges 1er cru « Les Vaucrains » 2022 - RED



Known until 2019 as Domaine de la Poulette, this historic Côte de Nuits estate has been passed down almost entirely through the women of the same family for seven generations, its presence on the slope dating back to the reign of Louis XIV. It took its current name from its walled monopole, the Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru "Clos des Poulettes." Today it is run by Hélène Michaut, who took over in 2014, farming around 16 hectares across Corgoloin, Nuits-Saint-Georges and Vosne-Romanée.

Les Vaucrains is one of Nuits-Saint-Georges's most admired premier cru climats, a sun-trapping combe on oolitic limestone. It is known for wines built for the cellar: powerful, tannic and full-bodied, with a deep purple robe that turns toward amber after five years or so, and a nose running from blackcurrant and blackberry through liquorice toward truffle and musk with age. The 2022 stands among the domaine's finest premier crus — structured and long, built to pair with rich meats

in sauce or a washed-rind cheese such as Époisses, and to reward a decade or more in the cellar.

Domaine Pascal Renaud

Pouilly Fuissé 1^{er} cru « Les Bouthières » 2022 - White



Pouilly Fuissé has always been a great value for money inside the Burgundy mosaic of appellations : It has a typical minerality from its limestone underground, the rich and round fruitiness of the Maconnais, and a hint of oakyness from its local tradition of wood usage.

In a way, it has all the qualities of the Côte de Beaune, without the price!

Since 2020 only, it finally gained 22 different plots to become 1ers crus 5194 hectares total, representing 24% of the total of the appellation).

From those plots, "Les Bouthières" has the particularity to be rich of marls, and less of limestone, giving a soft and elegant style to the wines, reason why Pascal Renaud decided to age them specifically in larger oak contents, called "foudres".

Light fruit and elegant coconut notes, reserve the bottles for an aperitive with your best friends!

John Capuano Ferreri

Chassagne Montrachet 1^{er} cru « Morgeot » 2023 – White

Founded in 1987 and today run by John Capuano from a historic 18th-century house in the heart of Santenay, Domaine Capuano-Ferreri farms close to 8 hectares on some of the finest slopes of the Côte de Beaune, most of it classified Premier Cru. Grapes are harvested by hand and the wines are raised in French oak, with the estate's guiding philosophy being to let each terroir speak for itself.

Morgeot is one of the most celebrated white climats of Chassagne-Montrachet, prized for the generosity and richness it brings to Chardonnay while retaining real mineral tension. We had the 2020 version of this Chassagne 1er cru « Morgeot » in the caveau till recently, and how beautiful where the last bottles !

Rich, mellow in the texture, full of very ripe fruit with honey notes starting to bloom, exactly what I'm waiting from a great Chassagne 1er cru. And this is why I thought coming back to the same plot from the same estate in a quite comparable vintage could be nice, for you as well as for the Caveau.



Domaine Pascal Joseph

Blagny 1er cru « Sous le Puits » 2019 – RED



I wonder how many of you will ask themselves : where is Blagny ?

Well, you have to be a real Burgundy geek to know this very small appellation : Blagny is not even a village but a little « hameau », halfway between Meursault and Puligny Montrachet, in the upper part of the hill. 54 ha in total, 44 being 1^{er} crus.

But more interesting is that the whites from the hameau take the name of Puligny OR Meursault depending of the situation of the plot, when the reds are called Blagny.

Domaine Joseph Pascal, based in Puligny Montrachet, produces a little of this red appellation, defined by a

strong tannic structure than needs a real ageing and air to soften.

This 2019, ready to drink with its gamey character, is a clear vision of an « old school » type of Burgundy, dense and quite dry.

Definitely not the kind I'd drink on its own, but definitely something I'd love during the cold season !

Domaine de la Monette

Mercurey «Les Chavances » 2024 - RED

Set in the heart of the Côte Chalonnaise, Domaine de la Monette is a certified-organic estate now led by young Burgundian winemaker Pierre-Étienne Chevallier who continues the meticulous, low-intervention approach established by his predecessors, a dutch couple who started organic farming more than 20 years ago. The domaine's wines have earned steady recognition in the French specialist press for their precise expression of the appellation's varied terroirs.

Trying for the first time “Les Chavances” last February, I thought this could be the best Mercurey and best village level wine I had tried from the vintage in the Côte Chaonnaise.

Well-balanced between structure and finesse, bright ruby fruit, refined and well-defined on the palate, with the kind of poise that pairs naturally with poultry, white meats and other refined dishes rather than heavier fare: Now, thinking about what's on the table for thanksgiving, could'nt it be 2026's winner?



Domaine du Couvent

Gevrey Chambertin 1^{er} cru « La Romanée » - Monopole – 2022 - RED



Domaine du Couvent, run by philippe Chéron and his 2 sons Paul & Hugo, holds several exceptional monopoles on the slopes above Gevrey-Chambertin, and La Romanée is the jewel of the collection. This walled clos of just over a hectare dates back to the 12th century, once tended by the monks of Cluny. Perched high in the Combe de Lavaux at the forest's edge, it faces due south — an unusually warm plot for this part of the Côte de Nuits — on soils of pure white marl over limestone that store the day's heat and release it through the night.

Hand harvested and 80% whole clusters fermented, with fifteen months in French oak, this 2022 reveals aromas of red and black fruit, spice and crushed stone. The tannins are fine and supple, the finish long and precise:

Of course ageing is an option, but opening it two hours before a nice dinner is a really nice option too!

Domaine Laurent Roumier

Clos de Vougeot GRAND CRU 2020 - RED

Laurent Roumier is the cousin of Christophe Roumier of the celebrated Domaine Georges Roumier, and traces his own holdings back to the family estate his grandfather Georges founded in 1924. Today, Franck, the new generation, is stepping in. After working for a couple years in Vosne Romanée for Bruno Clavelier, making low interventions wines, he's now fully back on the 12 hectares family.

As you can see from the pictures, Franck on the left is the real “hand on”, or should we say “feet in”, as he loves more his vines than anything (exception maybe when he repairs his 1961 wolkswagen tube...). Corinne his mom is the easiest person I know in Chambolle, always laughing and nice (and easy to recognize with her blue hairs!). Laurent has the relaxed behavior of someone who knows the transmission is well done...

The 2020 is rich, deep and powerfull with dark, perfumed fruit, a firm yet refined tannic structure, and the freshness and vigour that mark a truly serious Grand Cru. Still youthful, it still needs patience and stands confidently alongside far more famous names from this stretch of the Côte de Nuits.
